



## Frequently Asked Questions for SLPs new to SC

All individuals who wish to verify legal requirements of license holders should consult the practice act and all relevant regulatory chapters for the practice of Speech-Language Pathology.

- **What is the difference between ASHA's CCCs and a state license?**

Licensure is designed to protect the public from harm. Certification is the public's assurance that an individual has voluntarily met rigorous, peer-developed and reviewed standards endorsed by a national professional body.

- **Is it illegal to practice Speech-Language Pathology or Audiology in South Carolina without a valid license?**

**YES!!**

No person may practice speech-language pathology or audiology without a license, unless you are in an exempt setting.

- **How do I obtain a license if I am already licensed in another state?**

The following information is from SC LLR:

1. Fully completed and notarized application accompanied by the appropriate fee amount (see Fee Schedule following). Incomplete applications will not be processed.

2. Verification of current Certificate of Clinical Competence from ASHA. Letters from ASHA verifying current certification must be mailed directly to this office. Photocopies are not acceptable.

3. Verification of licensure in another state. If you are currently licensed or have been previously licensed in another state, you must request that state to send verification of your licensure status directly to our office. Failure to do so can result in the delay of the application or license being processed.

- **How much time does an SLP-A have post application to complete the required 100 clock hours?**

SLP-As have 4 months post application to complete the required 100 clock hours under the direct supervision of a SC licensed SLP. This is a major change from the previous policy
